The past year has, happily, seen only four crimes reported. After the spate of burglaries last year (all on the same evening), it seems that the Golant Parish has returned to being an area with an extremely low crime rate. Some of this can be attributed to the first class members of the Boatwatch Scheme who do fantastic work both on the river as well as providing land patrols.

So, reported crime for the year is as follows;

3 x Theft Other, including Theft by Finding : One being the theft of a wallet from the canoe club, One being the theft of dinghy floorboards which were left next to the refuse bin in the car park and one being the Theft of a bag of Oak firewood from Penquite Quay.

1 x Theft from a Motor Vehicle other than a Motor Vehicle: A propeller was stolen from a boat on its mooring.

All of the above crimes remained undetected, however as you will see, a couple may well have resulted in either the tide playing an active role or someone tidying up near the waste bin?
